A good assembly of writers and academics from all regions were able to survey the ground covered over these 30 years, particularly in relation to our literary journals and the activities of the Commonwealth Institute in London, while important new areas in the field of translation were also discussed. In retrospect I think we can feel that much has been achieved and it is to be hoped that the next 30 years may see a further consolidation of the pioneer efforts.

On a sadder note, I regret to have to report the loss of one of our EACLALS members: Frau Prof.Dr. Edith Mettke of the J.F. Kennedy Institute, Berlin, who died last August.


